## 17. Chemoradiation and Responses to Last Week

- Is it a significant problem that Christians cannot honestly come to the same conclusion on what God's will is?

  - Is it possible that God's will is unchanging yet we each interpret it differently based on our own unique perspectives and points of view?

- In this VLOG we see a common error we have in dialog. Nabeel made the statement in the last VLOG that Jesus heals everyone that came to Him or was brought to Him. Those who disagreed with Nabeel's position gave scriptural proof that Jesus didn't heal every person.
  - Is this an example of a straw man fallacy?
- Nabeel is praising God because he has been fortunate enough to make it all the way to Chemoradiation.
  - Do comments like this make you consider what you have to be grateful for in your life?
- Is it right for Nabeel to say that he wants to be healed without radiation and without a gastrectomy, or should he just be seeking God's will?
- Do you suspect that Nabeel's walk with God is getting stronger or weaker through this experience?
- How strongly do you lean on scripture when you are experiencing a trial?
  - Do you study the scriptures in a way similar to what Nabeel is doing?
