## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Most revolutions are based on anger, revolt, and violence. In your opinion, what is the foundation of a servolution?
- 2. Serving others allows people to EXPERIENCE HEALING. Who receives the healing, the server or the person served?
- 3. Do you need to attend a large church to effectively serve your community?
- 4. Have you ever had the opportunity to serve someone and afterward find our that you were an answer to their prayers?
- 5. A servolution requires creative thinking, careful analysis, hard work, time, compassion, a sense of adventure, and many other characteristics. Can you think of any type of person who couldn't find a place to serve in a community of service?
- 6. Have you ever served someone and the experience unfolded in a way you never would have expected?
- 7. Have you ever been part of a service activity that received more positive or negative attention than you anticipated?
- 8. Has someone ever served you and you knew there were strings attached? Did it lessen the impact of their service on you or cause any negative feelings?
- 9. The Healing Place Church has the mandate to be "a healing place for a hurting world. Discovery Church has the mandate to "be a river, not a pond". What do these ideas mean to you? How would you expect people in these churches to act?
- 10. Have you ever been part of a service or ministry opportunity that opened doors to larger service or ministry opportunities?
- 11. What are some of the reasons that God may use smaller opportunities to unlock larger opportunities?
- 12. Have you ever received training to be part of a service or ministry opportunity? Did you get more practical knowledge from the training you received or from actually doing the work itself?
- 13. Have you ever been in a situation where someone served you in a way that was so meaningful that you were then comfortable with sharing a greater need with them?
- 14. Do you think the greatest source of relief and service in your community should be the Church or the government?



- 15. Should congregations open their door and invite community events into their church buildings even if was the possibility it might lead to negative public relations or press?
- 16. Why is directly serving people more impactful than writing a check and funding a service project?
- 17. Why is it important to keep your focus on building Christ's kingdom when you are serving others?
- 18. Do you think it is wise for Healing Place Church to promote other churches when they partner with them?
- 19. Do you think serving others is something Christians should expect each other to do?
- 20. If one your "church friends" never serve inside or outside of the church, would you point out the importance of service to them?
- 21. Do you agree with the author's assertion that if a church focuses on serving its community it will never have to worry about attendance?
- 22. Have you ever served or been served in the aftermath of a natural disaster?
- 23. Are you aware of how your church partners with other churches in the community?
- 24. What are some things you can do to assure that you do not get an elitist attitude while you are serving others?
- 25. What are some of the differences between how the church should be serving its community and how secular "social-justice" endeavors impact communities?
- 26. Have you ever served others with other members of your family? How did that impact your relationships?
- 27. Is it reasonable to expect that as you are serving and meeting someone's need that other, potentially more serious, needs may arise? Why is that?
- 28. Is every service opportunity a multi-person project?
- 29. Do you agree with the author when he says "the poor" includes those in poverty, in bondage, under oppression, and downtrodden?
- 30. Have you ever served someone only to find out later that your actions had a far greater impact than you expected?
- 31. Have you ever considered that every time someone serves that they pay a price for those they are serving?



- 32. The reality is that it's not possible to meet everyone's needs. How should we decide which needs we endeavor to meet?
- 33. What are the different ways that service opportunities can be evaluated for effectiveness and impact?
- 34. What would motivate some Christians to criticize other Christians who are serving their community?
- 35. Would you expect Satan to attack you if you are effective serving other people and making an impact for Christ?
- 36. If your church closed tomorrow, would the community take notice?
- 37. When you serve with other people do take time to serve the servers as well?
- 38. Do you know what your gifts are? Would you like to have people help you understand your gifts better?
- 39. Have you ever been served as just one people in a crowd? Was that experience as impactful as being served as an individual?
- 40. Do you actively seek opportunities to serve those around you?
