- Nabeel is getting ready to see a new oncologist and start new DNA testing and other procedures. Does this strike you as a lack of faith?
- Nabeel has a “Go Fund Me” account so people can assist with his medical expenses. Do you see this as a way that God is providing for Nabeel and his family or is this just asking people for money?
- Nabeel states that the way that discipleship is accomplished is:
 - Set the example.
 - Teach others how to follow that example.
 - Confirm they are following that example.
 - Send them out into the world to start it over.
 - Is this how you have witnessed successful discipleship in the past?
 - Do you have this cycle active in your life?
